- Study how the use of digital as opposed to printed material in ESL 1020 might assist or inhibit the language learning of our students. I intend to examine most particularly how self-paced learning in an ESL classroom might encourage students to acquire the language (e.g., lexicon, composition skills) faster, while also taking into consideration how well students retain what they have learned when working at their own pace and how effectively they apply writing skills and explore ideas in writing when left to guide themselves through the process.
- Work with Dev Ed and ESL faculty to consider a level of developmental reading and writing, subsequent to ESL Level Four, that will be designed specifically for non-native speaking students.
