

COURSE OBJECTIVES

ESL 1040 GRAMMAR is designed to improve students' comprehension and production of grammatically accurate English. To achieve this goal, students are expected to:

1. Analyze and identify the grammatical structure of written and spoken English.

2. Practice producing grammatically accurate sentences in spoken and written English.

While the types of grammatical structures we study in this course depend on the needs of the students, typical structures at an advanced level of ESL include the following:

- 1. verb tenses
- 2. articles
- 3. prepositions
- 4. subject-verb agreement
- 5. modal verbs

- 6. passive voice
- 7. noun clauses
- 8. adjective clauses
- 9. adverb clauses
- 10. gerunds and infinitives

COURSE POLICIES

- 1. **Grade:** To successfully complete this course, a student must have a grade of C (74%) or above. Students who have below a C average should plan on retaking the course.
- 2. **Language:** Students should try to speak only English in class in order to improve their skills. Students who use another language too often may lose points from their final grade.
- 3. **Attendance:** If you miss a classroom assignment or exam, you can only make up the work if you have notified the teacher. I will take attendance every day. You will not lose points if you are absent, but students who miss class tend to perform poorly on exams. Also, those students who attend regularly are more likely to receive bonus points at the end of the term.
- 4. **Assignments:** Each student must take all exams and complete all classroom assignments shown on the schedule below. Late assignments will only receive partial credit.
- 5. **Materials:** Bring the course materials, a notebook, a pen, and a dictionary with you to class everyday.
- 6. **Mobile phones:** Limit the use of mobile phones during class time to emergency use only. Turn your phone off or set it to silent mode while in class. If you receive an emergency phone call, excuse yourself quietly and answer the call outside the classroom. Do not talk on your phone in the classroom.
